Why should we complete We are the ACP? so glad vou asked! First of all, the numbers you report on the ACP or the Annual Church Profile tells the story



We are autonomous; yet, we are connected through our state convention (MBCB) and included in the larger framework of our national convention (SBC). From our beginning, Southern Baptists have been a missionary people with a missions heartbeat. Historically, this missions fervor was fueled by the teaching and promotion of missions at every level of local church life. Organizations like WMU, Baptist Men, Acteens, GAs and RAs taught us to see a world in need of Jesus. In recent years, too many of our churches have eliminated such a focus on missions to the extent that we are no longer capturing the hearts and minds of our people for missions.

This is especially true of our children and teens. Many current and former missionaries testify that God touched their hearts for missionary service during these early years. When churches lose their missionary focus, they do so at their own peril, often becoming so inwardly focused they abandon their vision of a world in need of Christ.

Let me offer two ways to help overcome this issue. First, restore an emphasis on teaching missions in your church. We can help you do this.

Second, look for ways to engage with missionaries. Take note of this opportunity in our own association. Each year we have provided "*MISSIONARIES-IN-RESIDENCE*" where we invite a missionary couple to be in our association and available to talk about what God is doing in their ministry area. February 13-16, 2022, we will have Jared and Tara Jones, who serve in East Asia, available to speak to groups in your church. Please call the Association office soon to schedule them.

PASTORS!! Mark your calendars for Wednesday, October 6, 2021, 10:00 a.m. until NOON, for the *January Bible Study Preview*. The subject for the January 2022 study will be "Selected Psalms." Dr. Jerry Rankin, who authored the study material for Life Way, will be our presenter. We will meet in the Training Center. Come to enjoy the fellowship in the Word and with fellow pastors.

Condolences to Dr. Jimmy Stewart for the loss of his father, Dr. Don H. Stewart, on Tuesday, August 10, 2021.

Dr. Don H. Stewart was Chairman of the Department of Religion and Philosophy and Professor of New Testament and Greek at William Carey College for 15 years. He then served as Executive Vice President at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary and then Professor of New Testament and Greek. He was named Professor Emeritus of New Testament and Greek upon retirement from NOBTS in 2003 after 25 years of dedicated service. Dr. Stewart served as pastor and interim pastor in numerous churches in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama. He also traveled to 19 countries teaching, preaching, and serving.

A Partnership Gulf Coast Success Story...

Grateful! This is how I sum up my experience from hosting a "Backyard Bible Club" this summer. When Dionne Williams asked me if my church would consider hosting a youth mission team from FBC Myrick my initial response was hesitation. My brain started spinning with questions as Dionne started explaining how another church had to back out and he needed a church to host this group. I began thinking of the logistical issues: where would they stay, who in my church could host this group for four days, how would we get the word out, how much of this would I wind up doing myself because I don't know if I can pawn it off on any of my church members.

Yet, as Dionne continued to explain the benefits of an old idea that has come back around again, my enthusiasm began to grow. My desire for my church to connect with people who do not attend my church or perhaps any church began to swell. So, I made the commitment. Two weeks later, the pastor and youth pastor from FBC Myrick were sitting in my office along with Dionne from our Gulf Coast Baptist Association. We hashed out the logistics, made our plan, and went to lunch.

I am so thankful that our association had the foresight to put everything necessary for a successful Backyard Bible Club on their website. FBC Myrick took this information and ran with it. Now it was up to myself, my wife, and my church volunteers to take care of the prep work. Host home (my home) – check. Canvass my neighborhood with volunteers from my church – check. Tables, chairs, big tent, snacks, refreshments, fans cause it's 90 degrees even in the evening – check. Pray for the Lord to bless and hope kids actually come to a stranger's house (my house) – check. And God showed out.

Day 1 – amazingly eight kids came to the Robinwood Kids Club. Did I mention we changed the name from "Backyard Bible Club" to "Robinwood Kids Club?" I thought what parent is going to allow their child to go play in a stranger's fenced in back yard. Also, six parents came on day one, sat around in lawn chairs, and enjoyed getting to know one another. **Day 2** – eleven kids came, and six parents (four from day one and two new parents) sat around and continued getting to know one another. Bonus from day two, three siblings shared that they had never been to church and asked if they could have a Bible. **Day 3** – the storms rolled in so we cancelled only to realize about four kids had ridden their bikes in the rain to our house because they wanted to come to our Kids Club. **Day 4** – we prayed for no rain and thirteen kids came back for the final day of Kids Club along with eight parents. I got to present the Bibles to the parents of the children. All the parents thanked us for hosting a Bible club for their kids. Even the families who don't go to church. The neighbors want to get together again and are interested in visiting my church.

Grateful, thankful, humbled, and making plans to do more Backyard Bible Clubs next summer. Thank you, Dionne for setting this up. Thank you FBC Myrick youth group for doing games, crafts, and Bible stories. Thank you volunteers from Robinwood Baptist Church who helped make the Robinwood Kids Club a success. Thank You, Lord, for prompting me to let go of my

hesitation and allowing You to impact boys and girls in my neighborhood who don't go to church to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ!
