"100th Birthday of the Baptist Faith & Message & the Cooperative Program"

As we approach this year's annual Southern Baptist Convention, I want to point out two important anniversaries that we are celebrating this year. In 1925, Southern Baptists launched the Cooperative Program and adopted the Baptist Faith & Message.



The Cooperative Program (CP) was a "never-before-attempted method" of funding for helping SBC churches combine their finances for ministry and mission efforts. As each church gives to their State Convention, a portion of the funds are then forwarded to the SBC for its work. The CP has allowed us to become a great mission-sending, church planting, and ministry training convention. We have six of the largest seminaries in the nation. We currently support just over 3500 overseas missionaries. We have planted more than 11,000 churches in North America in the past 15 years. From this giving model, we are able to do amazing work that allows more people around the world to hear the Gospel and receive Christ! Thank you for giving to CP to support our Mississippi Baptist Convention and Southern Baptist Convention. (Thank you also for your additional giving to the Association!)

The Baptist Faith and Message (BF&M) was originally adopted to provide a unified statement of faith as a response to theological challenges in the early 1900s. The BF&M gives basic statements on our Southern Baptist beliefs and provides a guide for doctrinal accountability. The doctrines serve as a theological anchor for our churches and SBC institutions.

(Just as a side-note, all of our GCBA churches are SBC churches. The second sentence of our GCBA Constitution indicates: "This Association shall be composed of persons who have been duly elected as messengers by Southern Baptist Churches, cooperating with the Gulf Coast Baptist Association....")

Historically, the BF&M was crafted to define our beliefs while also defending our Baptist faith against cultural, political, and theological challenges. It has been revised three times (1963, 2000, 2023), and each revision reflects our effort to remain faithful to Scripture while also dealing with the needs of the current times. Therefore, many of our churches use the BF&M as a teaching tool to help church members know what we believe as Southern Baptists.

I am so grateful for what we Southern Baptists have been able to accomplish through our combined giving to the CP and through our fidelity to our beliefs in the BF&M! Happy 100th Birthday to both the CP & the BF&M! The strength of both prove that we continue to be *Better Together!*


